2019 Cezve/Ibrik Rules and Regulations

## Major Changes

<p>1.1.3 Competitors must hold a valid passport from the country he or she represents, or documentation substantiating 24 months of residency, employment or scholastic enrolment, some portion of which must have been within 12 months preceding the qualifying national competition. Competitors may only participate in one country per CIC Competition Year. A CIC Competition Year is defined as the time between the completion of one year's CIC Event and the completion of the next year's CIC Event.</p>	<p>Competitors must hold a valid passport from the place they represent or documentation substantiating 24 months of residency, employment or scholastic enrolment, some portion of which must have been within 12 months preceding the qualifying national competition. Competitors may only participate for one sanctioned National Body per WCE Competition year. A competition year is relative to the World Championships for which a National Body event is qualifying a competitor to compete. (e.g. if the competitor is competing in any NB event that would qualify them for a 2019 World Championship, they must compete for that NB exclusively in any NB event that is a qualifier for any 2019 World Coffee Championship.</p>	<p>Edited the wording for clarity on the restrictions on competing in more than one NB in one competition year.</p>
<p>2.2.1 G.A simple cezve/ibrik coffee must be served with unflavoured water and a napkin.</p>	<p>This rule has been deleted.</p>	
<p>2.2.2 K. Signature cezve/ibrik coffee beverages must be served with a napkin and both unflavoured and flavoured water may be served. However, if flavoured water is served by the signature cezve/ibrik beverage, the competitor should offer the judge a separate glass.</p>	<p>This rule has been deleted</p>	
<p>6.2 [...] Water for the judges can be set on the judges' table during the competitor's preparation time; however, the water should not be pre-poured into glasses prior to the start of the competitor's performance/competition time.</p>	<p>Competitors are required to serve and/or provide unflavored water to the four (4) sensory judges for each beverage course. Competitors can serve unflavored water to the judges at the start of the performance time or when the first set of drinks are served. <p>7.5 [...] Competitors are required to serve water to the two sensory judges. Competitors can serve unflavoured water to the judges at the start of the performance time or when the first set of drinks are served. 14.2.3 Judges will listen to the tactile descriptions and explanations given by the competitor and compare those with the weight and mouthfeel and finish of the beverage served	Judges will record the tactile descriptions and explanations given by the competitor and compare that with the mouthfeel and finish experience of the served beverage. 14.3.6 Judges will listen to the flavour descriptions and explanations given by the competitor and compare those with the beverage served. There should be a correlation between the ingredients used in the beverage and its taste profile. Any flavour descriptors given by the competitor will be taken into consideration under this score. This score is based on how accurately the descriptors match the flavour of the signature beverage and the quality of these flavours. Flavour descriptors must be given or a score of zero will be received in this category.	Judges will take note of the flavour descriptors given by the competitor and compare those with the beverage served. The flavour profile of the beverage served should support specialty coffee. This score is based on how accurately these descriptors match the flavour of the signature beverage. Flavour descriptors must be given or a score of zero (0) will be received in this category. 14.4.2 Over-preparation should be marked down (e.g. pre-poured water in the water glasses, etc.).	This rule has been deleted in line with changing the rule so that competitors can prepare their water before their performance time.
